
THE CHALLENGE:

CHESHIRE WEST STREET PASTORS

WE ARE:

- part of a national organisation
- well trained volunteers from many diverse local churches
- teams working in Chester city centre's night-time economy
- on duty every Friday & Saturday night from 10pm to 3am
- endorsed and supported by the Police and Cheshire West & Chester Council
- in touch with the police, door staff and CCTV, via City Link radios, when on patrol
- unpaid volunteers who give up their time at least once per month to serve their community
- people who have a heart for the disadvantaged and marginalised in the local community

RECRUITMENT CRITERIA:

- 18yrs of age minimum (no upper age limit), male or female
- to have a Christian faith and be a member of a recognised local church and for at least the last 12-months
- your church leader to provide a positive reference
- to be able to commit to approx 30 hours of training in the first year
- to work well in a team and go out on patrol at least once a month

WHAT WE DO:

- pastor = caring, listening, helping
- provide help and support to those in need
- reduce the vulnerability of lone individuals
- calm emotional or aggressive situations
- provide directions to local taxi stands, the train station, cash dispensers and local pubs and clubs
- signpost people to support services

WHAT WE DON'T DO:

- give out money for taxi fares!
- give out food, drink (except bottled water) or clothing
- work as individuals we are always in teams of 2 or more
- · work for the Police or the Council
- preach we are there to listen, care and help
- make judgments about people's lifestyles
